HOW TO PLAY THE GREAT GAME OF BOWLS

- 1. A normal club game consists of 12 ends and lasts (more than one hour)
- 2. It's a lot like curling on grass, only MUCH WARMER (and many often say more challenging) Others tell us it is a cross between billiards and curling.
- 3. Bowls are heavier on one side than on the other, so they "curl" or "bend" towards the side called the 'bias'. A set of Bowls consists of 4 identical bowls. They come in several sizes. Choices are to fit the player's hand and bias choice depends on green condition.
- 4. The amount of curl depends on the speed of the green and can range from as little as 30 cm (on a very soft green) to as much as 6 m on a hard fast green.
- 5. Games can be played with 1-4 players per team. *singles & pairs each player plays 4 bowls

 *triples each player plays 3 bowls

 * in fours each player plays 2 bowls
- 6. The first player (Lead) chooses the position of the mat on the centerline of the rink and rolls a 3" white ball (called a 'jack' or 'kitty') towards the opposite end of the green to be the target.
- 7. Provided the Jack is bowled far enough (23m) and remains in play, it is centered on the green and the same player then rolls a bowl from the mat, trying to stop it as near as possible to the jack.
- 8. Players take turns, by position, delivering their bowls until all the bowls have been played.
- 9. A Bowl is permitted to strike and move the jack or to knock it out of play.
- 10. A Bowl (during it's original course) that strikes a Jack becomes a "TOUCHER".
- 11. A Jack or a toucher that goes into the end ditch is LIVE provided it stays in bounds.
- 12. A Bowl is permitted to strike and move other bowls or to knock them out of play.
- 13. The team whose bowl is nearest the jack counts one point for each bowl they have nearer than their opponent's best bowl.
- 14. The team who scored last delivers the jack and bowls first on the next end.
- 15. If a bowl or a jack is displaced by a player the skip of the opposing team shall restore it as near as possible to its former position.
- 16. If a bowl falls prior to or during measuring, the bowl shall remain in new position.

FYI: *** Crown bowling is a more informal variation of the on greens game.

- *** Short Mat bowling is an indoor version. Played on a mat about 6 ft by 40 ft long
- *** A bowling green is 37-40 metres square. The green is divided into rinks which are not less than 5.5 m nor more than 5.8 m wide. This allows several games to be played on separate rinks at one time.
